Illustration of difficult conditions is that start of 4th race was successful after three attempts. Two times RC recalled the fleet and finally third start at 12:40 was successful. Estonian Deniss Karpak needed about one hour under variable 10kn SE wind to pass the finishing line as first. Hungarian Zsombor Berecz, holding in pocket visa for next Olympics under coaching of Luca Devotti, entered second. Czech Ondrey Teplyjaj counts position 3 and Milan Vujasinovic entered as 4th.
