OPEN FINN EUROPEN CHAMPIONSHIP 2015 – MEDAL RACE SCHEDULED FOR TOMORROW

IVAN KLJAKOVIĆ–GAŠPIĆ IS ON THE LEAD

After two races Ivan Kljakovic- Gaspic contented concluded his Saturday sailing and from leading position is looking forward to Sunday’s medal race.

- I am satisfied and I feel good today, my sailing results today are excellent. It is pity that we did not succeed to finish already started third race as in that one I was among leaders in the moment when RC cancelled

race due to the lack of wind. – For the moment it looked like everything is settled, but ...- smiling have said Bambi.

After all up and downs of this exciting contest he holds leading position in fleet of 71 sailor from 30 countries who had entered this Open European Championship for seniors and juniors being organized under authority of YC Labud.

Yesterday day was tough and tiring for Bambi as after difficult day on the sea he was forced to stay in situ until late evening to take part in hearings due to protests placed during the races. Luckily it did not affect his Saturday’s sailing.



- I am focused to myself and my sailing, and it paid off. With leading position I am entering medal race on Sunday. Silver is already in the pocket, I shall stand up on podium so I shall enter in medal race without calculations. I am going for gold and another European Champion title – quoted Bambi while rinsing his dinghy that will bring him in tomorrow's final race deciding of medals.

Leading Bambi has 46 negative points, New Zealander Josh Junior has 48, while Slovenian Vasilij Zbogor is third with 65 negative points, being in front of British Edward Wright with 71.



- Super sailing today, I remained in top and I can only say I enjoy. More than satisfied I look forward for medal race – said with content smile Zbogor who like Feniks from the ashes raised to top. Unsuccessful beginning he annulated with excellent sailing on Friday's strong south-easterly and continuing with fine sailing on Saturday there he is on third position in the eve of medal race.

Start of this decisive race is on Sunday noon. Only ten top sailors of the fleet will sail out to compete on course that should be set up for about 30 minutes of racing. Course set up depends on wind force which as per forecast will not be fresh, however exciting sailing is expected.

Race area between islands of Ciovo and Solta Charlie is most probable. One more Croatian sailor will take part in medal race, CRO 69 Milan Vujasinovic (YC Split)

- I am entering from 8th position and can not pretend for medal but I shall sail to gain the best possible at the end. - quoted Dugi.

He, as well as Kljakovic, is collecting the criteria points for 2016 Rio Olympic's visa. This European counts in that respect as well as Gold Cup in New Zealand end of this year.

After the medal race rest of the fleet, 61 sailor, will sail out, if weather conditions will be satisfying. They will then decide rank from 11th to 71st and also who will be bronze junior medallist. Among them for the medal with exceptional chances will compete 22 years old Nenad Bugarin (YC Labud). Gold and silver juniors will be Russian Arkadiy Kistanov and Australian Jake Lilley who are the only juniors in medal race. Nenad Bugarin in overall rank holds 18th position, while 20th is Josip Olujic also YC Labud and finally 46th position keeps Tudor Bilic (YC Trogir)

Two Russian in the medal race!

Saturday, the day before the last one of Finn European, has been expected impatiently as scored points from races completed made possible numerous calculations in predicting who will take part in medal race.

In the morning 10 kn SE wind announced that more than one planned race might be completed and so all options for first ten positions remained open.

- Our Russian boys are doing really well and we shall have two of them in medal race – quoted Russian Vasilij Kravchenko, Finn class measurer who joined us at sea this Saturday.

- Young Arkadiy Kistanov is excellent, although only 20 years old junior he is proving to be a top skipper. His time is still to come – proudly said Vasilij about his young countryman and having also in mind other Russian sailor Egor Terpigorev while commenting their performance here in Split.

Vasilij still sails himself and is also successful in world of business – he is General Manager of Mitsubishi Electric for Russia. He continued with compliments to Championship host YC Labud congratulating for equally successful organization on sea and ashore. - You have beautiful town and I do sorry that I did not have more time for sightseeing. Regarding the sailing condition weather was entirely on our service, enough wind and on Friday may be even too much for some of the sailors – analysis Vasilij while carefully observing if the Finns on sea are in accordance with class rules. That is his task – measuring and check-

ing that equipment is within the prescribed rules thus enabling to all competitors fair competition.

He commented with sympathy contest for Mister of Finn European 2015 and on question weather he will agree to be a candidate he replied smiling – Well, if you are going to organize Masters Championship I might accept.

Ivan Kljakovic –Gaspic (YC Labud) has good reasons to be One more European medal is in his pocket. If he win the gold that would be the second won in Split (first was won in 2010) or third altogether as he was gold in Varna 2009.

Since 2008, he is frequently on podium when Finn European contests are in question.

Scarlin 2008 he took bronze, then two gold in row, Varna and Split, silver in 2011, bronze again in Scarlin 2012.

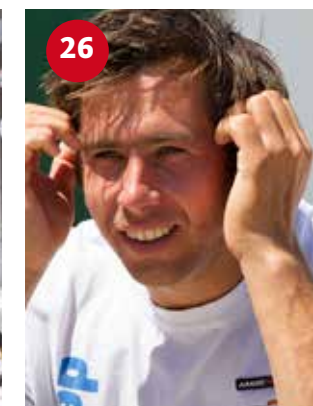
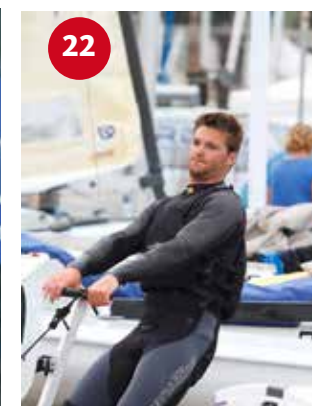
When Gold Cup is in question bronze he took in 2009 in Vallengbeak and then silver in Santander 2014.
